Program Note

"La Pastorella dell'Alpi"

Gioachino Antonio Rossini (1792 - 1868)

La Pastorella dell'Alpi is a charming and picturesque piece by Gioachino Rossini, written in the style of operatic arias typical of his time. The piece depicts the life of a shepherdess, a romanticized rural maiden who tends to her garden, cultivating both fruit and flowers amidst the beauty of nature. The shepherdess is courted by several suitors, but only one truly understands her heart and mind. The aria is a celebration of nature's simplicity and beauty, intertwined with the themes of love and longing. Rossini's music brings the rustic setting to life with its lyrical melodies and elegant ornamentation, evoking the peacefulness and enchantment of the Alpine countryside.

"Breit über mein Haupt"

Richard Strauss (1864 - 1949)

Breit über mein Haupt, composed by Richard Strauss in 1898, is a poignant German art song from his cycle 6 Lieder aus Lotosblätter, based on the text by Adolf Friedrich. The title translates to "Unbind your black hair," evoking a sense of intimate longing and desire. The song reflects the speaker's yearning for their lover, expressing a deep emotional connection with their beloved's physical features—her hair, eyes, face, and soul. The music captures this yearning with lush, sweeping melodies conveying passion and tenderness. As part of a set exploring themes of longing and beauty, Breit über mein Haupt stands out for its rich expressiveness and lyrical depth, showcasing Strauss's ability to evoke the complexities of love through his music.

"Cuando Tan Hermosa Os Miro"

Joaquín Turina (1882 - 1949)

Cuando Tan Hermosa Os Miro is a Spanish art song composed by Joaquín Turina, set to the text by the renowned poet Lope Félix de Vega Carpio. The title translates to "When I gaze on thy great beauty," and the lyrics reflect the speaker's admiration and devotion to the object of their affection. The song is an ode to the beloved's beauty, exploring the deep emotional connection between the speaker and their lover. Turina's music complements the lyrical content with rich harmonies and a flowing, expressive melody, enhancing the feelings of romance and adoration described in the text. This piece exemplifies the passionate intensity often found in Spanish music, drawing on the cultural traditions of Spanish songs while also showcasing Turina's distinctive musical voice.

"Ah, Love, But a Day!"

Amy Beach (1867–1944)

From Amy Beach's Three Browning Songs, Ah, Love But a Day! explores the delicate and bittersweet emotions of a faded love. Through poignant lyrics and a deeply expressive melodic line, Beach conveys the profound sadness and reflection accompanying the loss of love. Whether interpreted as a separation, a passing, or a waning of affection, this piece masterfully captures the complexities of human emotion through its lush harmonies and heartfelt delivery.

"La Zingara"

Gaetano Donizetti (1797–1848)

La Zingara tells the story of a lively gypsy woman who captivates the townsfolk with her ability to predict the future by reading palms. In a twist of fate, she reads the hand of a handsome man and finds herself falling in love with him. This delightful piece showcases Donizetti's flair for combining dramatic storytelling with sparkling melodies, creating a charming and spirited narrative of love and fate.

"Ici-Bas!"

Gabriel Fauré (1845–1924)

Composed in 1873, Gabriel Fauré's *Ici Bas!* is a hauntingly beautiful art song set to a reflective poem by René François Armand Prudhomme. The title, which translates to "Here Below," captures the poem's theme of longing for a love that transcends the fleeting and impermanent nature of earthly life. Through a delicate interplay of melody and harmony, Fauré creates a poignant atmosphere of wistful introspection, inviting listeners to reflect on the transient beauty of life and the yearning for something eternal.

"Nuit d'étoiles"

Claude Debussy (1862 - 1918)

Nuit d'étoiles is a French art song that captures the essence of the late Romantic era. Written by poet Théodore de Banville, the piece tells the sorrowful tale of a heartbroken narrator who has lost his lover, and finds solace in the stars above. The melancholy yet serene imagery of the night sky inspired Claude Debussy to arrange this composition, marking one of his earliest music publications. With its delicate harmonies and expressive vocal lines, Nuit d'étoiles offers a glimpse into the emotional depth and evocative atmosphere of 19th-century French music.

"Die Nacht"

Richard Strauss (1864 - 1949)

In *Die Nacht*, German composer Richard Strauss brings to life the haunting and mysterious theme of the night, as envisioned by poet Heinrich von Gilm. The poem speaks of the night as a force that steals away all familiar comforts—nature, life, and love itself. The piece conveys a sense of fear and the unknown as night casts its dark shadow over the familiar world. An

interesting historical connection lies in the fact that Heinrich von Gilm passed away in the same year Richard Strauss was born, a unique correlation that adds depth to the emotional undercurrent of this song. Strauss's arrangement highlights the dramatic tension between light and dark, both in the text and in the music, drawing the listener into the night's encompassing mystery.

"In Uomini, In Soldati" From "Cosi fan tutte" Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756 - 1791)

In Uomini, In Soldati is a lively aria from Mozart's Così fan tutte, an Italian opera that explores the themes of love, fidelity, and deception. This aria is sung by Despina, a clever and witty maidservant, in Act I, Scene III. After overhearing a conversation between the two sisters, Dorabella and Fiordiligi, about their love for men, Despina enters and humorously dissects their idealized view of masculinity. She presents a satirical and somewhat cynical perspective of men, suggesting that they are not as noble and steadfast as the sisters believe. With playful melodies and a lighthearted tone, Despina's aria is both comedic and revealing, offering a dramatic commentary on the nature of love and relationships, although the sisters remain unimpressed by her words.

"Là Ci Darem la Mano"

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756–1791)

Là Ci Darem la Mano is a celebrated duet from Mozart's opera Don Giovanni. This scene captures the cunning and charismatic Don Giovanni as he attempts to seduce Zerlina, a young peasant woman betrothed to Masetto. With a blend of tender melody and subtle manipulation, the duet unfolds as an intimate yet duplicitous exchange. Don Giovanni's persuasive charm is juxtaposed with Zerlina's initial hesitation, creating a dramatic interplay that highlights Mozart's genius for character development through music.

"Dalla Sua Pace"

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756–1791)

Dalla Sua Pace is a poignant aria from Act II of Mozart's opera Don Giovanni. Sung by the noble Don Ottavio, the piece serves as a heartfelt introduction to his character. Through this aria, Ottavio expresses his sorrow and frustration over Donna Anna's distress following the tragic events surrounding her father's death. His lyrics reflect deep devotion as he wishes for Anna's peace of mind and heart, making this aria a tender declaration of love and unwavering support. Mozart's elegant composition captures both the emotional depth and lyrical beauty of Ottavio's sentiments.

"Il Mio Tesoro Intanto"

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756–1791)

Il Mio Tesoro Intanto is a tenor aria from Act II of Mozart's Don Giovanni, first performed in 1787. Sung by Don Ottavio, this aria follows the emotional turmoil of his fiancée, Donna Anna,

as she grapples with the murder of her father. In this moment of lyrical beauty, Ottavio vows to seek justice for her, displaying his unwavering loyalty and noble character. The aria is a masterful blend of virtuosity and tenderness, showcasing Mozart's ability to convey profound emotion and character depth through music.

"Tonight" From West Side Story Leonard Bernstein (1918 - 1990)

"Tonight" is a duet from Leonard Bernstein's iconic musical West Side Story, which draws inspiration from Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet. In this heartfelt duet, Tony and Maria, the young lovers from opposing sides of a turbulent neighborhood rivalry, express their intense feelings for one another. Their love, though forbidden by the world around them, offers a sense of hope and transcends the divisions of their families and social backgrounds. The piece is filled with passion and optimism, as both characters believe that love can conquer all obstacles. With Bernstein's expressive musical setting, Tonight has become one of the most iconic love duets in musical theater, encapsulating the purity and intensity of youthful love amidst a world of conflict.

"Ave Verum Corpus"

W.A. Mozart (1756–1791)

Arranged by Patrick M. Liebergen

One of Mozart's most beloved choral works, *Ave Verum Corpus* is a beautiful sacred motet written in 1791, just a few months before his death. The piece, which translates to "Hail, True Body," is a short yet profound reflection on the Eucharist, evoking a sense of reverence and serenity. Mozart's elegant harmonies and flowing lines express a deep reverence for the sacred, and in Patrick M. Liebergen's arrangement, this timeless piece is brought to life with fresh textures while preserving the original's emotional depth.

"Deep Peace"

Victor C. Johnson (b. 1981)

Deep Peace by Victor C. Johnson is a soothing choral piece that conveys a sense of tranquility and inner calm. Drawing inspiration from traditional Celtic prayers, the piece offers a gentle blessing, invoking peace in all aspects of life. Johnson's lyrical melodies and warm harmonies create an atmosphere of serenity, allowing the listener to reflect on the comforting power of peace.

"Stars I Shall Find in Winter"

Victor C. Johnson (b. 1981)
