### **What is Concurrent Enrollment?**

Concurrent enrollment allows high school students the opportunity to advance their college education while still in high school. Some courses are at a special reduced rate for concurrent students.

### **Will Concurrent Enrollment grant me High School Credit?**

Concurrent enrollment courses do not guarantee credit for high school requirements or credit.

### **What are the benefits of Concurrent Enrollment?**

Students have the opportunity to start earning college credit towards a college degree while still enrolled in high school. This gives students the opportunity to get a head-start in their college degree while saving money!

### **What courses can I take?**

Any course that is part of the Texas Common Core Curriculum, while meeting TSI Placement standards.

### **Do I have to take all sections of the TSI exam?**

Yes. However, students must meet the minimum score requirement in the respective assessment section of the course the students wishes to enroll in.

Example:

*If a student wishes to enroll in a introductory, college-level math course, that student must meet the minimum score requirement on the TSI Math section to enroll into the math course.*

### **What is the cost of the courses?**

Courses are at a reduced-rate if they are part of the Texas Common Core Curriculum. If the class is not part of core curriculum, the class will be charged at its regular price.

### **How many courses can I register for in one semester?**

A concurrent student may be enrolled into a maximum of six semester credit hours (i.e., 6 SCH) per academic semester.

### **Are classes Face-to-Face or Online?**

Students have the option of choosing either Face-to-Face instruction or online (as long as the course has an online option).

### **Will my Credits transfer to other colleges?**

If it is part of the Texas Common Core Curriculum, college credits will transfer to any public, in-state institution. All concurrent enrollment credits transfer to any TAMU degree plan.

### **How do I pay for my concurrent courses?**

If the student is eligible for the Concurrent Scholarship, the courses are free! Otherwise, arrangements must be made to pay out of pocket. Financial aid is not available for these courses.

### **How do I qualify for the Concurrent Scholarship**

To qualify, students must have a 85+ or 3.0+ school-issued GPA. Returning Concurrent Students must have a 3.0+ TAMU GPA.
